
# Collection of Fifteen Pictures and Portrait of the Painter


#### The Nature of Art

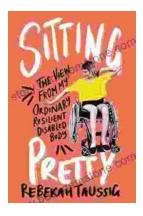
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
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
