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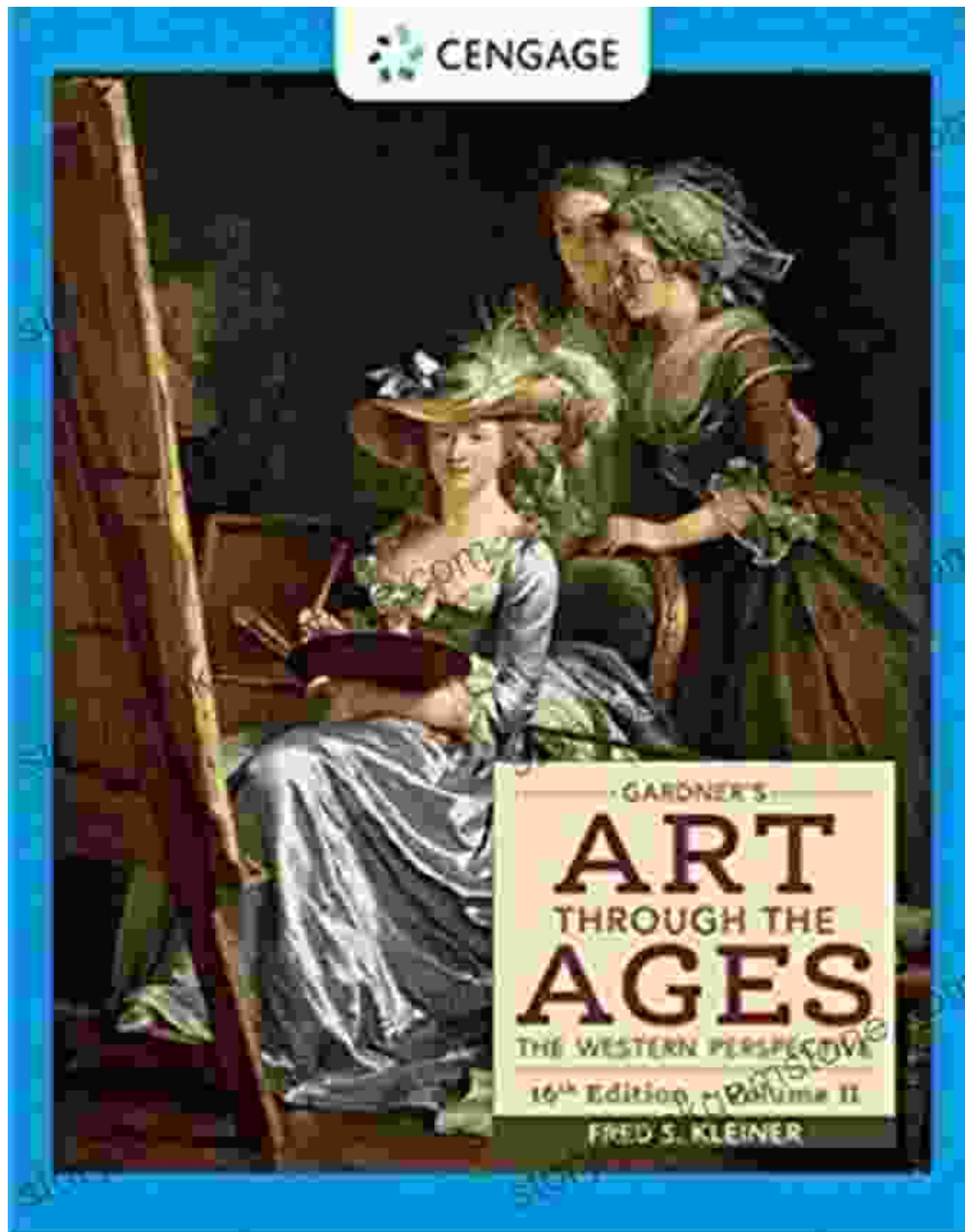
## Ancient Civilizations: Laying the Foundation

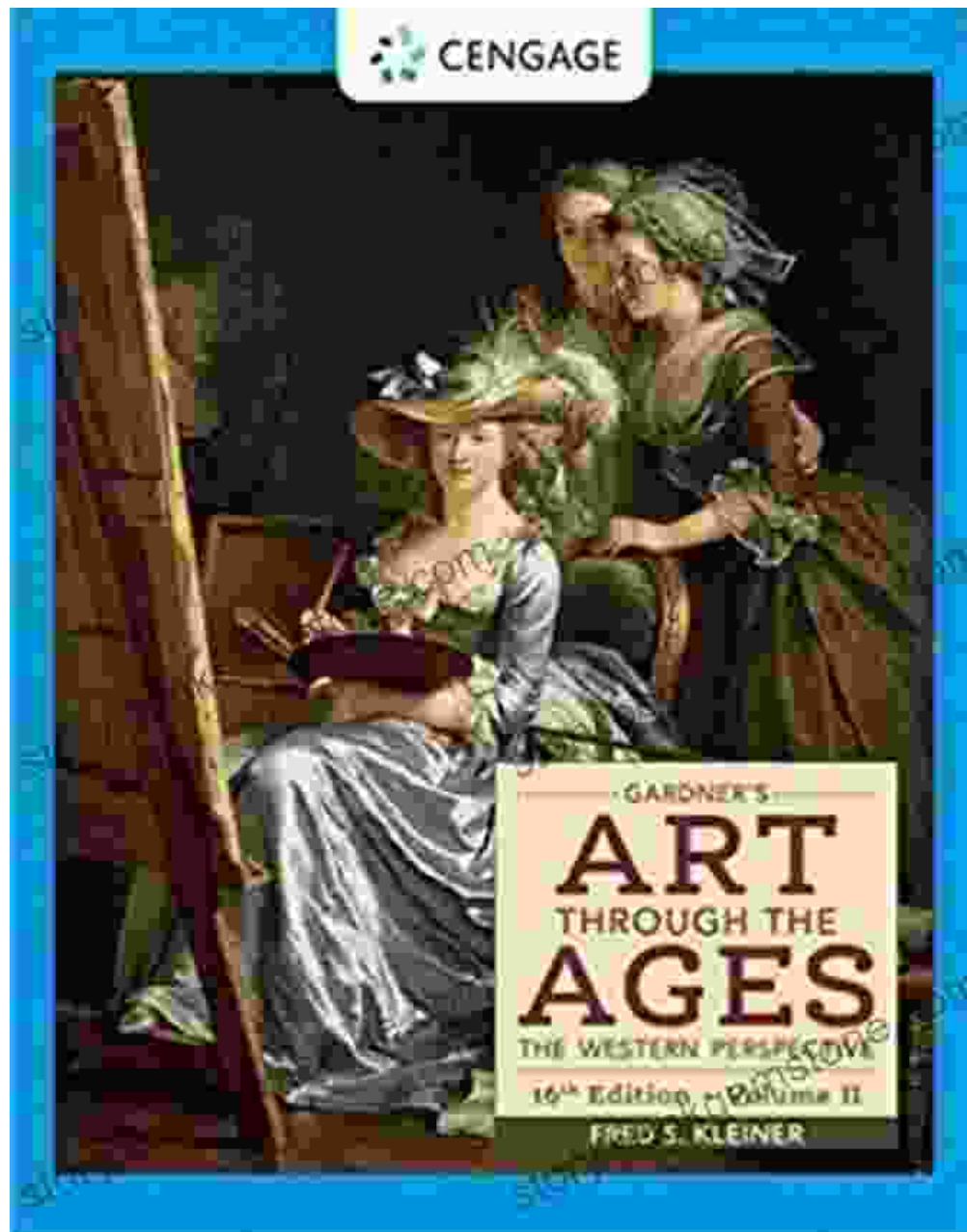


Sandro Botticelli, "Venus and Mars," c. 1483

## **Baroque and Rococo: Opulence and Drama**

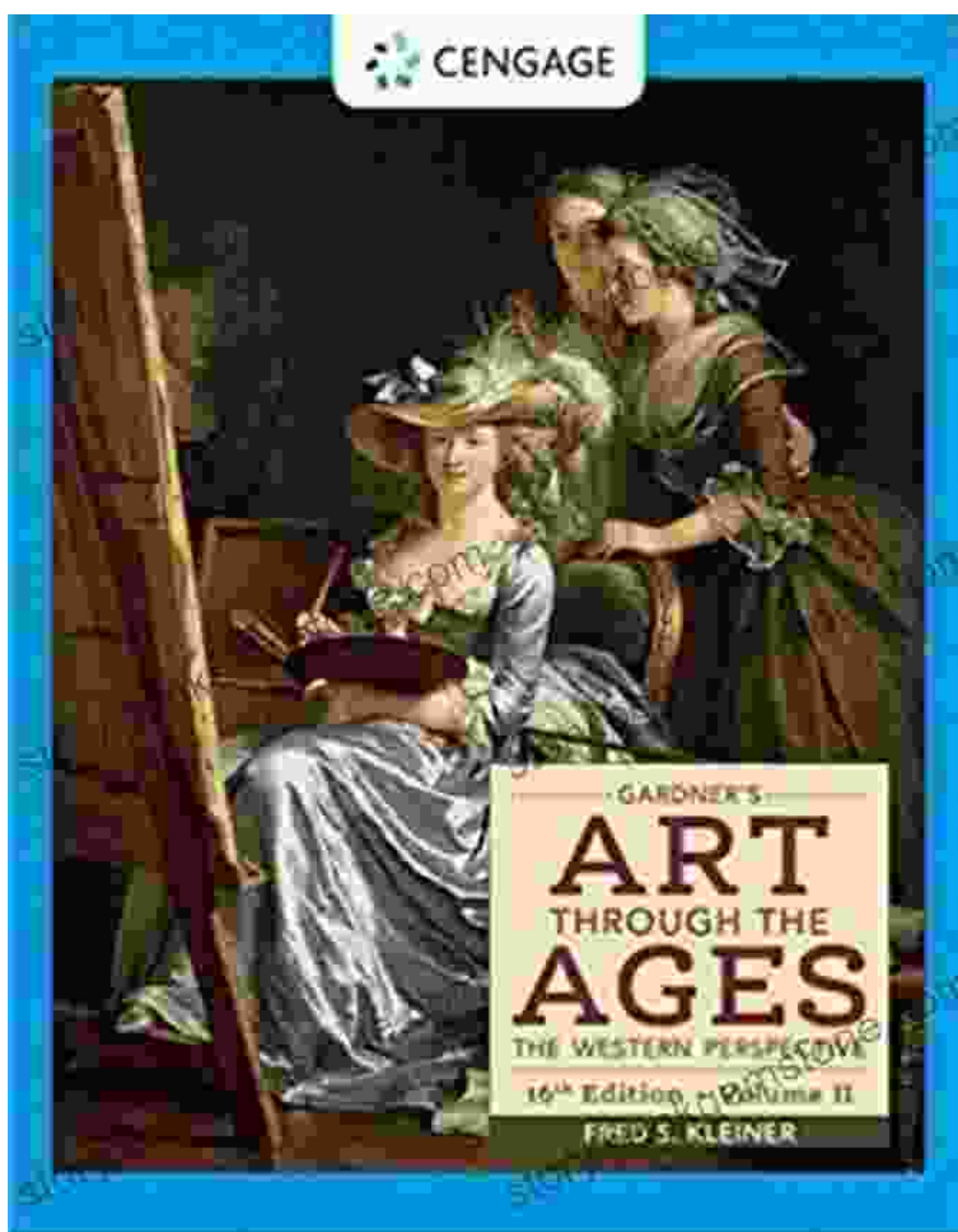

## Impressionism and Post-Impressionism: Capturing Light and Emotion

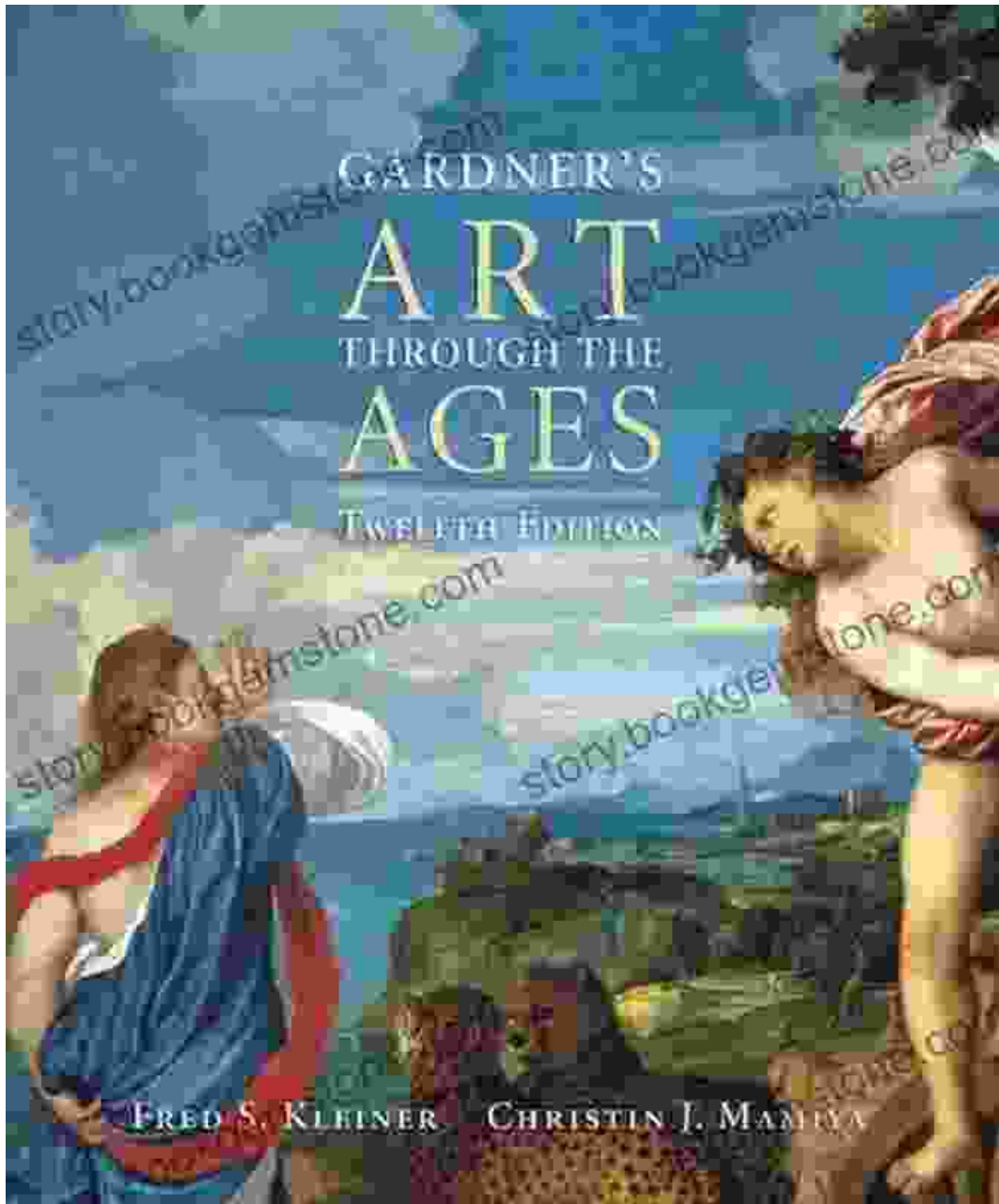

## **Modern Art: Breaking Conventions**

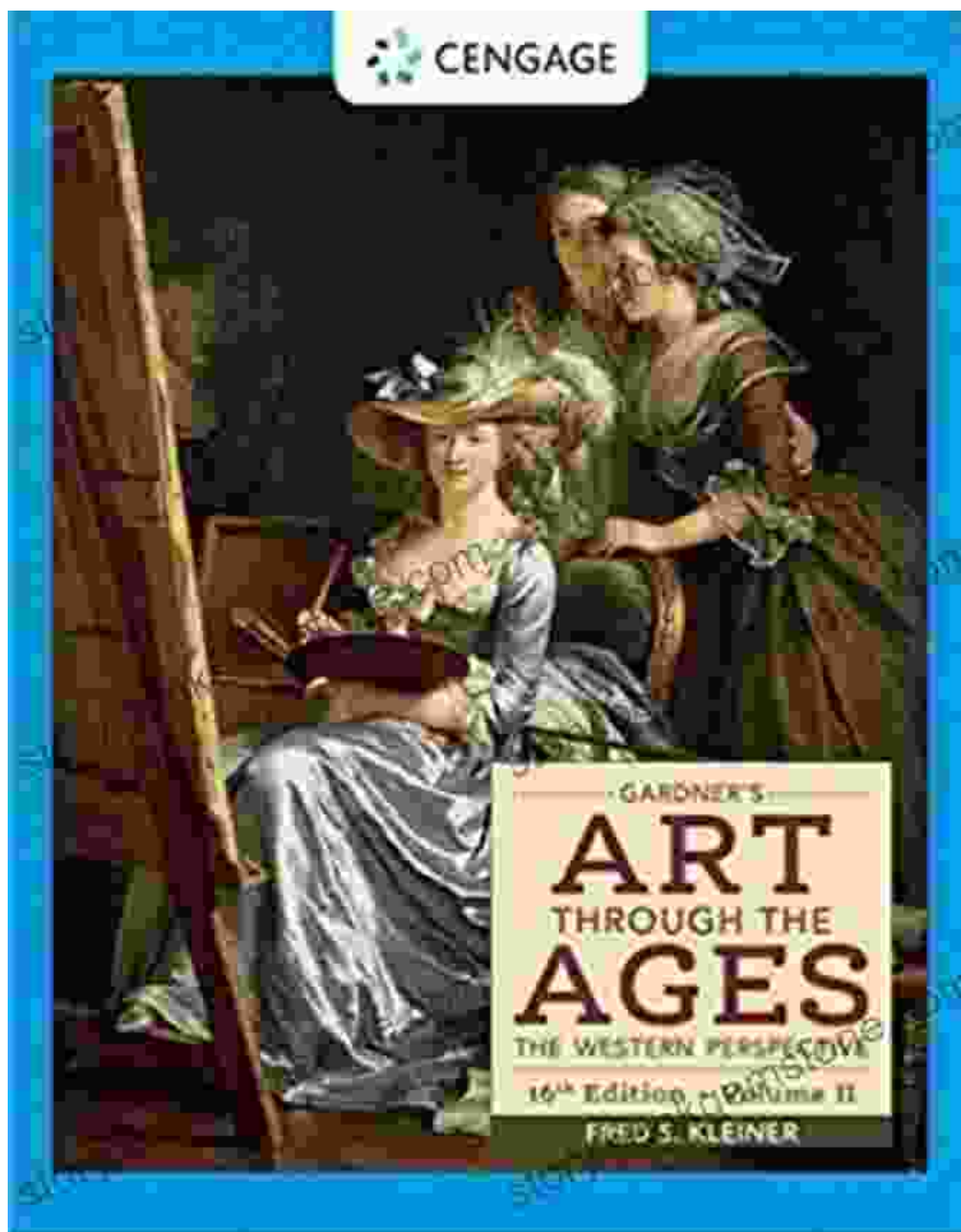

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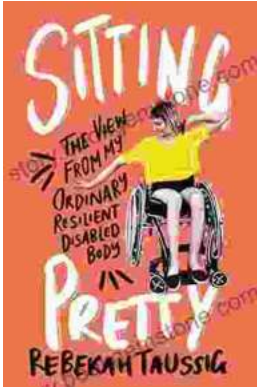
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
