These projects are perfect for kids of all ages, and they can be easily adapted to fit your child's interests and abilities. So what are you waiting for? Get started today!

Week 1: Build a Cardboard Fort

- 3. Fold the paper in half again, along the center line.
- 4. Fold the wings down.
- 5. Tape the wings in place.
- 6. Decorate the airplane.

Week 3: Build a Model Volcano

This is a great project for teaching kids about geology and chemistry. They'll love watching the volcano erupt!

- Materials:
 - Paper-mâché
 - Baking soda
 - Vinegar
 - Food coloring
 - Small bowl
 - Spoon

Instructions:

- 1. Create the paper-mâché volcano by covering a small bowl with paper-mâché.
- 2. Let the paper-mâché dry completely.

- 3. In a small bowl, mix together the baking soda and vinegar.
- 4. Add a few drops of food coloring to the mixture.
- 5. Pour the mixture into the volcano.
- 6. Watch the volcano erupt!

Week 4: Make a Solar System Mobile

This is a beautiful and educational project that will teach your kids about the planets in our solar system.

- Materials:
 - Styrofoam balls
 - Paint
 - Markers
 - String
 - Hanger

Instructions:

- 1. Paint the Styrofoam balls to represent the planets in our solar system.
- 2. Use markers to add details to the planets, such as craters and oceans.
- 3. Attach the planets to the string.
- 4. Hang the string from the hanger.
- 5. Enjoy your solar system mobile!

Week 5: Build a Birdhouse

This is a fun and rewarding project that will provide a home for birds in your backyard.

- Materials:
 - Wood
 - Nails
 - Hammer
 - Screws
 - Drill
 - Paint

Instructions:

- 1. Cut the wood to the desired size and shape.
- 2. Assemble the birdhouse by nailing or screwing the pieces together.
- 3. Drill a hole in the front of the birdhouse for the entrance.
- 4. Paint the birdhouse.
- 5. Hang the birdhouse in your backyard.



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

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
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
