

### Terry's Legacy


Terry Fox died on June 28, 1981, at the age of 22. However, his legacy continues to live on. The Terry Fox Foundation, which was founded in

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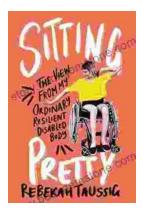
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
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
